APPLICATION OF PRICE LIST

This Price List contains the regulations and rates applicable to the furnishing of intrastate resale common carrier communications service by WiMacTel, Inc. within the State of Alabama.

SERVICE AREA MAP

WiMacTel, Inc. will provide intrastate service throughout the State of Alabama.

SECTION 1 - TECHNICAL TERMS AND ABBREVIATIONS

Access Line - An arrangement which connects the Subscriber's or Customer's location to the Carrier's designated point of presence or network switching center.

Aggregator - Any person, excluding local exchange carriers and cellular service providers that, in the ordinary course of its operations, make telephones available to the public or to transient users of its premises, for intrastate telephone calls using a provider of operator services.

Authorized User - A person, firm or corporation, or any other entity authorized by the Customer or Subscriber to communicate utilizing the Company's services.

Available Usage Balance - The amount of usage remaining on a Debit Account at any particular point in time. Each Debit Account has an Initial Account Balance which is stated either in U.S. dollars or Call Units, depending upon the type of service. The Available Balance is depleted as services provided by the Company are utilized by the Customer.

Collect Billing - A billing arrangement whereby the originating caller may bill the charges for a call to the called party, provided the called party agrees to accept the charges.

Commission - refers to the Alabama Public Service Commission.

Company - WiMacTel, Inc. ("WiMacTel"), unless otherwise indicated by the context.

Customer - The person, firm or corporation, or other entity which orders, cancels, amends, or uses service and is responsible for the payment of charges and/or compliance with Price List regulations.

Customer Dialed Calling Card Call - A service whereby the End User dials all of the digits necessary to route and bill the call to a valid non-Premiere calling card or credit card.

Customer Premises Equipment - Terminal equipment, as defined herein, which is located on the Customer's premises.

Day Rate Period - After 8:00 am to, but not including, 5:00 pm Monday through Friday.

SECTION 1 - TECHNICAL TERMS AND ABBREVIATIONS, (CONT'D.)

Debit Account - An account which consists of a pre-paid usage balance depleted on a real-time basis during each Debit Service call.

Debit Card - A card issued by the Company which provides the Customer with a Personal Account code and instructions for accessing the Carrier's network.

Debit Service Call - A service accessed via a "1-800" or other access code dialing sequence whereby the Customer or Authorized User dials all of the digits necessary to route a call. Network usage for each call is deducted from the available usage balance on a Company issued Debit Account.

Evening Rate Period - After 5:00 pm to, but not including, 11:00 pm Monday through Friday, and on Sunday.

Initial Usage Balance - The amount of usage on a Debit Account upon issuance and before any depleting call activity.

LEC - Local Exchange Company.

Marks - A collective term to mean such items as trademarks, service marks, trade names and logos; copyrighted words, artwork, designs, pictures or images; or any other device or merchandise to which legal rights or ownership are held or reserved by an entity.

Night/Weekend Rate Period - After 11:00 pm to, but not including, 8:00 am Monday through Friday, all day Saturday, and Sunday to, but not including 5:00 pm.

Operator Dialed Surcharge - A charge applying to calls made when the user dials "00" only or any valid company operator access code and requests that the operator dial the destination number.

SECTION 1 - TECHNICAL TERMS AND ABBREVIATIONS, (CONT'D.)

Operator Station Call - A service whereby the caller places a non-Person to Person call with the assistance of an operator (live or automated).

Person to Person Call - A service whereby the person originating the call specifies a particular person to be reached, or a particular station, room number, department or office to be reached through a PBX attendant.

Personal Account Code - A numeric or alpha-numeric sequence which uniquely identifies a travel card or debit card account.

Renewal - A method of replenishing a Debit Account's Available Usage Balance with additional minutes of usage as authorized and paid for by the Customer.

Sent Paid Coin - Sent paid coin rates apply to calls placed from pay telephone stations and paid for by depositing coins at the pay telephone and are rated in real time. A call of this type requires WiMacTel to communicate and collect the charges from the originating location.

Special Access - Where access between the Subscriber or Customer and the interexchange carrier is provided on dedicated circuits. The cost of Special Access is billed to the Customer by the local exchange carrier, or other approved access provider.

Sponsor - A corporation or other legal entity that exclusively permits the use of its Marks to the company for use with telephone cards or other merchandise, and contracts with the company for the marketing of the services described herein.

Subscriber - The person, firm, corporation, or other legal entity which arranges for services of the Company on behalf of transient third party Customers or Authorized Users. The Subscriber is responsible for compliance with the terms and conditions of this Price List. A Subscriber is also a Customer under the terms of the Price List.

Switched Access - Where access between the Customer and the Carrier is provided on local exchange company circuits capable of accessing the local switched network. The cost of switched Feature Group access is billed to the Carrier.

SECTION 1 - TECHNICAL TERMS AND ABBREVIATIONS, (CONT'D.)

Terminal Equipment - Devices, apparatus, and associated wiring, such as teleprinters, telephones, or data sets.

Third Party Billing - A billing arrangement by which the charges for a call may be billed to a telephone number that is different from the calling number and the called number.

V & H Coordinates - Geographic points which define the originating and terminating points of a call in mathematical terms so that the airline mileage of the call may be determined. Call mileage is used for the purposed of rating calls.

WiMacTel - Used throughout this Price List to refer to WiMacTel, Inc. unless otherwise clearly indicated by the context.

SECTION 2 - RULES AND REGULATIONS

2.1 Undertaking of WiMacTel

WiMacTel's services and facilities are furnished for communications originating at specified points within the State of Alabama under terms of this Price List.

WiMacTel installs, operates, and maintains the communications services provided herein under in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth under this Price List. WiMacTel may act as the Customer's agent for ordering access connection facilities provided by other carriers or entities, when authorized by the Customer, to allow connection of a Customer's location to the WiMacTel network. The Customer shall be responsible for all charges due for such service arrangement.

The Company's services and facilities are provided on a monthly basis unless otherwise provided, and are available twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven days (7) per week.

2.2 Limitations

- **2.2.1** Service is offered subject to the availability of the necessary facilities and equipment, or both facilities and equipment, and subject to the provisions of this Price List.
- **2.2.2** WiMacTel reserves the right to discontinue or limit service when necessitated by conditions beyond its control, or when the Customer is using service in violation of provisions of this Price List, or in violation of the law.
- **2.2.3** The Company does not undertake to transmit messages, but offers the use of its facilities when available, and will not be liable for errors in transmission or for failure to establish connections.
- **2.2.4** All facilities provided under this Price List are directly or indirectly controlled by WiMacTel and the Customer may not transfer or assign the use of service or facilities without the express written consent of the Company. Such transfer or assignment shall only apply where there is no interruption of the use or location of the service or facilities.
- **2.2.5** Prior written permission from the Company is required before any assignment or transfer. All regulations and conditions contained in this Price List shall apply to all such permitted assignees or transferees, as well as all conditions of service.
- **2.2.6** WiMacTel reserves the right to discontinue the offering of service or deny an application for service if a change in regulation materially and negatively impacts the financial viability of the service in the best business judgment of the Company.

2.3 Use

Services provided under this Price List may be used for any lawful purpose for which the service is technically suited.

2.4 Liabilities of the Company

- **2.4.1** WiMacTel's liability for damages arising out of mistakes, interruptions, omissions, delays, errors, or defects in transmission which occur in the course of furnishing service or facilities, in no event shall exceed an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the Customer for the period during which the faults in transmission occur.
- **2.4.2** The Company shall not be liable for claim or loss, expense or damage (including indirect, special or consequential damage), for any interruption, delay, error, omission, or defect in any service, facility or transmission provided under this Price List, if caused by any person or entity other than the Company, by any malfunction of any service or facility provided by any other carrier, by an act of God, fire, war, civil disturbance, or act of government, or by any other cause beyond the Company's direct control.
- **2.4.3** The Company shall not be liable for, and shall be fully indemnified and held harmless by Customer against any claim or loss, expense, or damage (including indirect, special or consequential damage) for defamation, libel, slander, invasion, infringement of copy-right or patent, unauthorized use of any trademark, tradename or service mark, unfair competition, interference with or misappropriation or violation of any contract, proprietary or creative right, or any other injury to any person, property or entity arising out of the material, data, information, or other content revealed to , transmitted, or used by the Company under this Price List; or for any act or omission of the Customer; or for any personal injury or death of any person caused directly or indirectly by the installation, maintenance, location, condition, operation, failure, presence, use or removal of equipment or wiring provided by the Company, if not directly caused by negligence of the Company.

2.4 Liabilities of Company, (Cont'd.)

- **2.4.4** The Company shall not be liable for any defacement of or damages to the premises of a Customer resulting from the furnishing of service which is not the direct result of the Company's negligence.
- **2.4.5** The Company shall not be liable for any claim, loss, or refund as a result of loss or theft of Debit Cards or Personal Account codes issued for use with the Company's services. Nor will the Company be liable for any claim, loss or refund on any unused balance remaining on a Debit Card provided to a Customer.
- **2.4.6** The Company shall not be liable for any claim, loss or refund on any unused portion of the usage balance remaining in a Debit Account provided to a Customer before or after the expiration date assigned to each Debit Account.

2.5 Deposits

The Company reserves the right to collect a deposit from the Customer in the event the Customer's financial condition is unknown or unacceptable to the Company. Deposits will be returned to the Customer after one full year's history of timely payment. All deposits will be collected and refunded in compliance with APSC General Rule 8.

2.6 Advance Payments

For Customers whom the Company feels an advance payment is necessary, WiMacTel reserves the right to collect an amount not to exceed one (1) month's estimated charges as an advance payment for service. This will be applied against the next month's charges and a new advance payment may be collected for the next month.

2.7 Taxes

All state and local taxes (i.e., gross receipts tax, sales tax, municipal utilities tax) are listed as separate line items and are not included in the quoted rates for services paid for in arrears. All state and local taxes are included in the quoted rates for prepaid services.

2.8 Terminal Equipment

The Company's facilities and service may be used with or terminated in Customer-provided terminal equipment or Customer-provided communications systems, such as a telephone set, PBX or key system. Such terminal equipment shall be furnished and maintained at the expense of the Customer, except as otherwise provided. The Customer is responsible for all costs at his or her premises, including personnel, wiring, electrical power, and the like, incurred in the use of the Company's service. When such terminal equipment is used, the equipment shall comply with the generally accepted minimum protective criteria standards of the telecommunications industry as endorsed by the Federal Communications Commission.

2.9 Installation and Termination

Service is installed upon mutual agreement between the Customer and the Company. The service agreement does not alter rates specified in this Price List.

2.10 Payment for Service

The Customer is responsible for payment of all charges for services and equipment furnished to the Customer for transmission of calls via the Company. This includes payment for calls or services originated at the Customer's number(s); placed using a Debit Card as a form of payment regardless of the purchaser of the card or the originating location of the call; incurred at the specific request of the Customer. The Customer agrees to pay to the Company any cost(s) incurred as a result of any delegation of authority resulting in the use of his or her communications equipment and/or network services which result in the placement of calls via the Company. The Customer agrees to pay the Company or its authorized agent any and all cost(s) incurred as a result of the use of the service arrangement, including calls which the Customer did not individually authorize.

All charges due by the Customer are payable to the Company or any agency duly authorized to receive such payments. Payments for service provided in association with Company-issued Debit Accounts must be received by the Company or its authorized agent prior to the activation of the Customer's Debit Account. The billing agency may be the Company, a local exchange telephone company, or other billing service. Terms of payment shall be according to the rules and regulations of the agency and subject to the rules of regulatory agencies having jurisdiction. Any objections to billed charges must be promptly reported to the Company or its billing agent. Adjustments to Customers' bills shall be made to the extent that circumstances exist which reasonably indicate that such changes are appropriate.

The customer shall be responsible for all calls placed via the Debit Account as the result of the Customer's intentional or negligent disclosure of their Personal Account Code. Charges for installations, service connections, moves, and rearrangements, where applicable, are payable upon demand by the Company or its authorized agent.

2.10 Payment for Service, (Cont'd.)

2.10.1 Consumer Refunds

The Company reserves the right to offer consumer refunds, where appropriate, on operator assisted calls through two refund methods:

A. Direct Refund

Customers will be offered a full refund which can either be applied to the Customer's LEC bill, credit card account or sent via company check. Credits issued to the LEC bill may take up to 2 - 3 billing cycles to be credited to the account based upon the processing requirements of the Customer's serving LEC.

B. Refund Balance Card

Customer choosing this option, if offered by the Company, will receive a refund balance card as an alternative to a direct refund. The card will have the full refund value for the first 60 days after date of issue. The card will be subject to a monthly service fee of \$2.50 applied against the unused balance after an initial 60 day period.

2.11 Cancellation by Customer

Customer may cancel service at any time by providing either verbal or written notice to the Company.

2.12 Interconnection

Service furnished by WiMacTel may be connected with the services or facilities of other carriers. Such service or facilities, if used, are provided under the terms, rates and conditions of the other carrier. The Customer is responsible for all charges billed by other carriers for use in connection with WiMacTel's service. Any special interface equipment or facilities necessary to achieve compatibility between carriers is the responsibility of the Customer.

2.13 **Refusal or Discontinuance by Company**

- **2.13.1** WiMacTel may refuse or discontinue service with five (5) days written notice to the Customer for any of the following reasons:
 - (A) For failure of the Customer to pay a bill for service when it is due.
 - (B) For failure of the Customer to meet the Company's deposit and credit requirements.
 - (C) For failure of the Customer to make proper application for service.
 - (D) For Customer's violation of any of the Company's rules on file with the Commission.
 - (E) For failure of the Customer to provide the Company reasonable access to its equipment and property.
 - (F) For Customer's breach of the contract for service between the Company and the Customer.
 - (G) For a failure of the Customer to furnish such service, equipment, and/or rights-of-way necessary to serve said Customer as shall have been specified by the Company as a condition of obtaining service.
 - (H) When necessary for the Company to comply with any order or request of any governmental authority having jurisdiction.

2.13 **Refusal or Discontinuance by Company**

- **2.13.2** WiMacTel may refuse or discontinue service without notice to the Customer for any of the following reasons:
 - (A) In the event of tampering with the Company's equipment.
 - (B) In the event of a condition determined to be hazardous to the Customer, to other Customers of the Company, to the Company's equipment, the public, or to employees of the Company.
 - (C) In the event of a Customer's use of equipment in such a manner as to adversely affect the Company's equipment or the Company's service to others.
 - (D) In the event of fraudulent use of the service.

SECTION 2 - RULES AND REGULATIONS, (CONT'D.)

2.14 Interruption of Service

Credit allowances for interruptions of service which are not due to the Company's testing or adjusting, to the negligence of the Customer, or to the failure of channels, equipment or communications systems provided by the Customer, are subject to the general liability provisions set forth in Section 2.4 herein. It shall be the obligation of the Customer to notify Company immediately of any interruption in service for which a credit allowance is desired by Customer. Before giving such notice, Customer shall ascertain that the trouble is not within his or her control, or is not in wiring or equipment, if any, furnished by Customer and connected to Company's terminal. Interruptions caused by Customer-provided or Company-provided automatic dialing equipment are not deemed an interruption of service as defined herein since the Customer has the option of using the long distance network via local exchange company access.

2.15 Inspection, Testing and Adjustment

Upon reasonable notice, the facilities provided by the Company shall be made available to the Company for tests and adjustments as may be deemed necessary by the Company for maintenance. No interruption allowance will be granted for the time during which such tests and adjustments are made.

2.16 Tests, Pilots, Promotional Campaigns and Contests

The Company may conduct special tests, pilot programs, waivers and promotions at its discretion to demonstrate the ease of use, quality of service and to promote the sale of its services. All tests, pilots, promotional campaigns and contests will be provided to the Commission prior to there implementation.

2.17 Cost of Collection and Repair

The Customer is responsible for any and all costs incurred in the collection of monies due the Company, including legal and accounting expenses. Customer is also responsible for recovery costs of Company-provided equipment and any expenses required for repair or replacement of damaged equipment.

2.18 Toll-Free Numbers

- **2.18.1** The Company will make every effort to reserve vanity numbers (i.e., "800/888") on behalf of Customers, but makes no guarantee or warrantee that the requested "800/888" number(s) will be available or assigned to the Customer requesting the number.
- **2.18.2** If a Customer accumulates undisputed past-due charges, the Company reserves the right not to honor the Customer's request for a change in "800/888" service to another carrier (e.g., "porting" of the "800/888" number), including a request for a Responsible Organization (Resp Org) change, until such time as all charges are paid in full.
- **2.18.3** "800/888" numbers shared by more than one Customer, whereby individual Customers are identified by a unique Personal Identification Number, may not be assigned or transferred for use with service provided by another carrier. The Company will only honor Customer's request for a change in Resp Org or "800/888" service, subject to the limitations provided in Section 2.18.2, to another carrier for "800/888" numbers dedicated to the sole use of that single Customer.
- **2.18.4** If a Customer who has received a toll free number does not subscribe to 800/888 service within ninety (90) days, the Company reserves the right to make the assigned number available for use by another Customer.

2.19 Late Payment Charge

A late fee of 1.5% per month will be charged on any past due balance.

2.20 Return Check Charge

A return check charge of \$10.00 will be assessed for checks returned for insufficient funds. Any applicable return check charges will be assessed according to the terms and conditions of the billing entity (i.e. local exchange company and/or commercial credit card company) and pursuant to Alabama law and the Alabama Public Service Commerce Commission regulations.

2.21 Other Rules

The Company may temporarily suspend service without notice to the Customer, by blocking traffic to certain cities of NXX exchanges, or by blocking calls using certain Personal Account Codes when the Company deems it necessary to take such action to prevent unlawful use of its service. The Company will restore service as soon as service can be provided without undue risk.

2.22 Public Telephone Surcharge

In order to recover Company expenses to comply with the FCC's pay telephone compensation plan Effective: November 23, 2011on October 7, 1997 (FCC 97-371), an undiscountable per call charge is applicable to all intrastate calls that originate from any pay telephone used to access Company provided services. This surcharge, which is in addition to standard tariffed usage charges and any applicable service charges and surcharges associated with service, applies for the use of the instrument used to access Company provided service and is unrelated to the service accessed from the pay telephone.

Pay telephones include coin-operated and coinless phones owned by local telephone companies, independent companies and interexchange carriers. The Public Pay Telephone Surcharge applies to the initial completed call and any reoriginated call (e.g., using the "#" symbol). The Public Pay Telephone Surcharge does not apply to calls placed from pay telephones at which the Customer pays for service by inserting coins during the progress of the call.

Whenever possible, the Public Pay Telephone Surcharge will appear on the same invoice containing the usage charges for the surcharged call. In cases where proper pay telephone coding digits are not transmitted to the Company prior to completion of a call, the Public Pay Telephone Surcharge may be billed on a subsequent invoice after the Company has obtained information from a carrier that the originating station is an eligible pay telephone.

SECTION 3 - RATES AND SERVICES

3.1 General

Service is offered to residential or business Customers and is available from equal access originating end offices only.

3.2 Calculation of Distance

Usage charges for all mileage sensitive products are based on the airline distance between serving wire centers associated with the originating and terminating points of the call.

The serving wire centers of a call are determined by the area codes and exchanges of the origination and destination points.

The distance between the Wire Center of the Customer's equipment and that of the destination point is calculated by using the "V" and "H" coordinates found in Telecordi's V&H Tape and NECA FCC Price List No. 4.

- Step 1 Obtain the "V" and "H" coordinates for the Wire Centers serving the Customer and the destination point.
- Step 2 Obtain the difference between the "V" coordinates of each of the Wire Centers. Obtain the Difference between the "H" coordinates.
- Step 3 Square the differences obtained in Step 2.
- Step 4 Add the squares of the "V" difference and "H" difference obtained in Step 3.
- Step 5 Divide the sum of the square obtained in Step 4 by ten (10). Round to the next higher whole number if any fraction results from the division.
- Step 6 Obtain the square root of the whole number obtained in Step 5. Round to the next higher whole number if any fraction is obtained. This is the distance between the Wire Centers.

Formula:

$$\sqrt{\frac{|V_1 - V_2|^2 + |H_1 - H_2|^2}{10}}$$

3.3 Timing of Calls

Billing for calls placed over the network is based in part on the duration of the call.

- **3.3.1** Timing for all calls begins when the called party answers the call (i.e. when two way communications are established.) Answer detection is based on standard industry answer detection methods, including hardware and software answer detection.
- **3.3.2** Chargeable time for all calls ends when one of the parties disconnects from the call.
- **3.3.3** Minimum call duration for billing purposes is one minute unless otherwise specified in the individual rate schedules of this rate sheet.
- **3.3.4** Calls are measured and billed in one minute increments unless otherwise indicated in this rate sheet. Any partial minute is rounded up to a full minute.
- **3.3.5** There is no billing applied for incomplete calls.

3.5 Operator Assisted Service

The Company provides the Customer operator assisted services to aggregator locations on a per call service charge basis. In addition to the per call service charge, mileage-sensitive usage rates apply. The company's operator services are accessible on a twenty-four (24) hour per day seven (7) days per week basis.

The use of the Company's operator services allows the Customer to select from the special call handling or billing arrangements specified within. Call rates and applicable service charges will be assessed to the call originator, the called party's telephone number based on the call type (i.e. operator dialed, collect, third party billed, credit card billed or customer dialed credit card billed without the use of an operator's assistance) initiated by the call originator and the appropriate acknowledgment of other parties, where applicable.

3.5 Operator Assisted Service, (Cont'd.)

3.5.1 WiMacTel Operator Services

A service provided to host locations for use by transient End users. This service anticipates the provision of Operator Services and/or billing options. Service is offered under this Tariff to Aggregators throughout the United States for interstate calling. Calls are routed over transmission and switching facilities of the underlying carrier to any valid NPA-NXX in the United States.

Calls are measured as described in Sections in this tariff and rated based on time of day, call duration and mileage. Per-minute usage sensitive charges, as well as per-call operator service charges apply.

A Operator Service Call Types

Credit Card - A service whereby the End User placing the call bills the call to a commercial credit card, such as MasterCard, VISA, American Express or Diners Club

Telco Card - A service whereby the End User placing the calls bills the call to a Telephone Company issued Calling Card, with or without Operator Assistance.

Operator Station - A service whereby the End User places a station to station call which is billed via credit card, calling, card, collect or third party with the assistance of an operator (live or automated)

Person-to-Person - A service whereby the End User originating the call specifies a particular person to be reached, or a particular station, room number, department, of office to be reached through a PBX attendant. A Person-to-Person call may be billed to the called party, a third number, a credit card or a calling card.

Time and Charges - A service whereby the End User requests the Company to monitor the start and stop time of a call for the purpose of on-site payment and/or other call accounting purposes.

SECTION 4 – MISCELLANEOUS SERVICES

4.1 Regulatory Compliance Fee

This fee allows the Company to recover expenses that the Company incurs with regard to the Universal Service Fund, National Number Portability and other regulatory fees. The fee is not a tax or charge imposed or required by any government entity.
